Our goal is that the young people at Love & Hope have a healthy and happy relationship with their families.

We aim to be holistic educators by offering solid academic instruction as well as exposure to a wide variety of activities, opportunities, peoples and cultures. We want each student to understand their world and the world around them. We teach respect for one's own culture and the culture of others, but above all, a respect and commitment to the culture of Christ. We aim to provide students with the opportunity to pursue their individual dreams, goals, ambitions, and aspirations regardless of their economic circumstances. Our goal is to help each student reach their full potential and the place in life to which God has called them.

Love & Hope is the work of God's Kingdom here on earth and we want to share that work with all who wish to serve. We view the home and its network of donors as a family. We want to create an environment in which supporters can develop meaningful and lasting relationships with the individuals they support.

### **OUR CORE PROGRAMS**

#### LOVE & HOPE CHILDREN'S HOME

In 2023, Love & Hope Children's Home began with just one remaining resident. Herberth turned eighteen in April and transitioned to the Horizon Home, signaling the end of our childcare program. This marked a significant shift in our ministry as we decreased from two homes down to one. While we bid farewell to our childcare program, we remain committed to supporting youth in El Salvador and exploring new avenues for impact and service.

#### **HORIZON HOME**

The purpose of the Horizon Home is to provide a safe, supportive environment for our young people who have turned eighteen, are still in school, and need a little more assistance before they can be completely independent. Just like a typical family, it is our goal to see all the young people who grew up at Love & Hope Children's Home become successful, independent adults. Each one of them is unique, and they each have their own gifts, talents, struggles and obstacles. The Horizon Home is currently home to five young people who grew up at Love & Hope Children's Home and are on this journey towards independence. Due to different circumstances and disabilities, total independence may not be feasible for all the kids at the Horizon Home, and we continue to ask God for provision in order to care for them as long as needed.



#### LOVE & HOPE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

As our young people grow and desire more independence, some of them choose to move out. This is not only permitted but encouraged. As long as they are achieving good grades and are keeping in touch, Love & Hope continues to support their education. In 2023, four of the young people who previously lived at Love & Hope but are now living independently, continued to receive full scholarships to continue their higher education journey.



Over the years, other kids have moved out, not by choice but because they are placed back with their biological families by the Salvadoran child welfare system. These kids may leave our home, but they will always remain part of the Love & Hope family. We continue to support their education by sending them to private schools near their home, as well as providing uniforms, school supplies, transportation and whatever else they need to successfully continue their academic journey.



### **OUR CORE PROGRAMS**

#### LOVE & HOPE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM (CONTINUED)

When Love & Hope identifies a hardworking, gifted student who lacks the financial ability to pay for college, we love to give them this opportunity. In 2023, Love & Hope took strides to expand our scholarship program, aiming to reach more young individuals in need of educational support. We formalized our application process and extended invitations to the youth of El Tanque Community, broadening our scope of impact. As a result, we awarded half-scholarships to two young ladies and a full scholarship to another young woman. They commenced their classes in January 2024. This expansion reflects our commitment to empowering youth through education and creating opportunities personal and academic growth within underserved communities. We are excited about the potential of these scholarships to transform lives and uplift communities, embodying our mission to spread love, hope, and opportunity.



#### **FAMILY OUTREACH**

Love & Hope Family Outreach goes beyond providing academic opportunities; our highly trained and educated staff assess families to identify needs and determine the most effective ways to address them. Through personalized support, we aim to empower families to overcome challenges and achieve their full potential.

Love & Hope provides funds to ensure families have access to adequate healthcare. In some cases, this includes covering expenses for doctor's visits, transportation to appointments, and necessary medications. By prioritizing their health and well-being, we strive to enhance the overall quality of life for the families we support.

We understand the importance of nutrition and basic household necessities for families in need. That's why Love & Hope offers food baskets containing essential staples like rice, beans, milk, eggs, bread, and meat. Additionally, we supply personal hygiene items such as toilet paper, toothpaste, soap, as well as cleaning supplies like laundry soap, dish soap, and floor cleaner. These provisions alleviate financial burdens and promote a healthier living environment.

Furthermore, Love & Hope provides ongoing support and counseling services to families facing various challenges. Our dedicated social worker maintains regular communication with families, meeting with them monthly to address any issues they may encounter. In times of greater need, families have access to professional counseling services, ensuring they receive the comprehensive support needed to thrive.

## **2023 HIGHLIGHTS**

#### **All Grown Up!**

After 21 years of dedicated service, Love & Hope Children's Home recently celebrated a significant milestone as our youngest child in the home, Herberth, reached the age of eighteen. Though Love & Hope Children's Home will no longer operate, our ministry remains active and committed to serving the youth of El Salvador. We are excited about many new opportunities ahead and grateful for the continued support of our donors and partners as we transition into this next chapter.

#### **Another Renacer Grad**

In December 2023, Chamba graduated from Renacer. Funded by the Puma Foundation, Renacer provides essential training and job experience to young people in El Salvador who have grown up at Children's Homes, empowering them for the transition into the workforce. Chamba joins many other graduates from Love & Hope Children's Home who have benefited from this same program. Love & Hope is grateful to have the support of the Poma Foundation in creating meaningful pathways to success for young people like Chamba.

#### **Thanksgiving Reunion**

The Love & Hope family experienced a heartwarming reunion over Thanksgiving, with nearly all our "children" in attendance. Several of them have transitioned into parenthood themselves, bringing their own little ones along. It was an evening filled with joy as we laughed, shared memories, and got caught up on everyone's lives. As we look ahead, we eagerly anticipate continuing to nurture these relationships, watching the young people who grew up at Love & Hope and their families flourish and grow.




#### Mi Lugar Seguro

As the culmination of Love & Hope Children's Home approached, we spent a lot of time praying and reflecting on how we can continue to utilize the resources and experience we've gained to address the needs in El Salvador. One area we felt passionate about was providing a daycare and after school program for kids whose parents work and cannot afford child-care. Many parents in this situation are either forced to leave kids alone at home, take them along with them to unsafe workplaces or leave them with unreliable caregivers.

We began taking initial steps to establish a daycare program in Santa Tecla. Through discussion with our board in El Salvador and meeting with the Mayor's office of Santa Tecla, we learned about a national initiative requiring daycare programs in workplaces with over 100 employees. Understanding that daycare facilities across the country will be increasing, we pivoted our approach. Instead, we opted to forge a partnership with an established NGO already fulfilling the very mission we envisioned.

Mi Lugar Seguro (My Safe Place) is a daycare, now expanded to include kindergarten and 1st grade, situated in an underprivileged community in Zaragoza. We are enthusiastic about this collaboration and eager to contribute to the meaningful work already underway.



#### **HERBERTH**

Herberth is 18 years old and is a senior at CEFAS high school. On Saturdays he attends English classes at the American School. Herberth's dream is to graduate from high school with good grades and obtain a scholarship abroad. He wants to study Finance.



#### **SALVADOR**

Salvador is 19 years old and studying to be a baker at the Agasal Academy. He also attends a Life Skills program at the Inclusive Vision Center for Training and Development, where they work on different areas to stimulate, develop, and prepare him for life. Salvador is doing an internship at a nearby tailor shop on Thursdays and Fridays. One of Salvador's dreams is to have his own bakery business.



#### **MOISES**

Moisés is 20 years old and is in his second year in his pursuit of becoming a Computer Science Engineer. He studies at Don Bosco University. After completing an internship, Moisés was offered a part time job in customer service at Credicomer. Moisés' dream is to graduate from university and obtain work in his field as a computer engineer.



#### **JEFFERSON**

Jefferson is 21 years old and is currently in his fourth year of the Advertising Graphic Design program at Francisco Gavidia University. All bachelor degrees in El Salvador are five year programs, so he has one year to go. Jefferson is doing social service for the Ministry of Labor in creating advertising and content on social media for different entrepreneurs. Jefferson also works part time at a call center called TELUS.

Jacobo is 22 years old and is currently in his fourth year of a five year degree in Marketing and Advertising at Francisco Gavidia University. One of Jacobo's short-term dreams is to complete his degree with honors, grow in knowledge and experience, both personally and professionally and enter the world of marketing. He would like to do this in another country to make his growth more enriching.

RACHEL SANSON VOICE


